CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at approximately 7:30 AM by Dan Eckersley, 2nd Chair of the Salt Lake County Board of Health.

CITIZEN PUBLIC COMMENT:

Comments are limited to 3 minutes unless otherwise approved by the Salt Lake County Board of Health. There was no public comment.

MINUTES:

There was no quorum present so there was no motion to approve the June 1, 2023 Board of Health meeting minutes.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Dan Eckersley, 2nd Chair, had nothing to report.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Dr. Angela Dunn, Director, gave the Director's report.

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Dr. Dunn let the Board know that the annual Board of Health and County Council Meet & Greet will be on September 19th.

Dr. Dunn let the Board know that there are currently two open Board seats. Jake Fitisemanu has been recommended to fill the seat as a representative of unregulated industry. The Mayor supported the recommendation and it will now go before the Salt Lake County Council for review and approval. The open seat that needs to be filled is for a representative who is a licensed non-healthcare professional. If anyone has recommendations, please send them forward.

Dr. Dunn informed the Board that the Health Department is working on workforce development initiatives. She briefly discussed the intern program and the Emerging Leaders in Public Health program.

Dr. Dunn mentioned a recent varicella outbreak at a homeless resource center. She highlighted the successful collaboration between epidemiologists, public health nurses and community health workers in helping this population with the care they needed. She also mentioned a crypto outbreak that was identified, and interventions put in place to help mitigate the spread of crypto.

Dr. Dunn mentioned Health Department representation at the national NACCHO conference recently. Some of the health department team presented their work addressing the opioid crisis.

VAPE ON MAIN APPEAL:

The Board received a request from Vape on Main to appeal the Chief Hearing Officer's Decision and Order. After a brief discussion, it was determined that Kalina Duncan, Dan Eckersley and Dr. Stacy Bank will be on the subcommittee that will review the appeal and make a recommendation to the Board.
